Tips for defending yourself against fraud

Keep an eye out for “fishy” texts and emails. Pay attention to the name of sender. Does the email address match who the sender is claiming to be? Does the sender *exactly* match previous texts or emails from the same source?

Never give out personal information to unknown sources. Scammers sometimes pretend to be your bank through emails, calls or texts. If you’re unsure about a caller claiming to be your bank, hang up and call the number of the branch you typically conduct business with.

Review password strength and account details. It’s a good idea to use a different user name and password for your online banking account in case one of your other online accounts is hacked. Make sure your personal info, like your cell number and email address is up to date on our system so that we can quickly contact you if we notice suspicious activity.
