
hard working farmers across our region and the nation, working day and night to bring food to tables all over the world. Like the saying goes—"If you ate today, thank a farmer."

Leadership Bismarck-Mandan — Dallon Bitz



This past year, I had the honor of being chosen as a participant for the Leadership Bismarck-Mandan program through the Bismarck-Mandan Chamber EDC. Every year, a committee at the Chamber EDC selects up to 20 participants for the program based on criteria surrounded around interest in our community's well-being, willingness to be involved in community service, and potential for community leadership.

My 17 classmates and I met every two weeks from September through March to learn about some of the most compelling issues that captivate our community today, become familiar with industries and business sectors that we don't often cross paths with in our every day lives, and network with like-minded individuals who also want to invest themselves in the future of the Bismarck-Mandan community. Some of the issues days we participated in included Law & Legislature, Agriculture, Energy, Economic Development, Arts & Leisure, and Education among many others. We were—fortunate to learn from and interact with many leaders in our community as well, such as Msgr. Shea and Sister Thomas Welder, the superintendents of both the Bismarck and Mandan public school systems, business leaders from Cloverdale Foods, MDU Resources, BNI Coal and Sanford Health, local law enforcement officers, local nonprofit organization leaders from HIT, Inc., Global Neighbors and the United Way, local state legislators Rick Becker and Pat Heinert, and North Dakota Supreme Court Justice Gerald VandeWalle.

My experience in the program was very eye opening. I learned so many things about my community that I never would have been exposed to if it weren't for Leadership Bismarck-Mandan. And even more amazing was the experience I had developing a local project with five of my classmates. Our Leadership class split into three groups to form projects that could benefit our community, and my group chose to develop a Bike Share Program. The program was approved by the Chamber EDC in July and may be implemented into our community as early as Spring 2021! We still have a long way to go, but we are making progress and looking forwards to our next steps of soliciting grant money to get the program up and running.

I highly recommend this program to anyone who would like to know more about the community we call home. The experience I've had is one that will have a great impact on my career in banking, and the relationships I've built through this program will last a lifetime. I extend my gratitude to the leaders at Security First Bank for recommending me for this program, and I hope to see more of my coworkers participate in Leadership Bismarck-Mandan in the future.
